FFA Members Vie for Selection to Compete in 2023 National FFA Agricultural Proficiency Awards

More than 20 agricultural teachers and college professors from throughout the U.S. recently met virtually to determine what FFA members will compete for top honors in the 2023 National FFA proficiency award areas. Brooke Casey of the New London FFA chapter in New London, WI, has been named a national finalist this year for the Veterinary Science Agricultural Proficiency Award. She is the first national finalist New London has had since 2005.

Agricultural Proficiency Awards honor FFA members who, through supervised agricultural experiences (SAEs), have developed specialized skills that they can apply toward their future careers. Students compete in areas ranging from agricultural communications to wildlife management.

Proficiency awards are also recognized at local and state levels and provide recognition to members exploring and becoming established in agricultural career pathways. This award is supported by Merck Animal Health, Elanco Animal Health, Tractor Supply Company, US Poultry & Egg Association, Zoetis, Indiana Farm Bureau and Farm Bureau Insurance, Phibro Animal Health Corporation, and Sustainable Futures Fund.

Brooke looks forward to interviewing with a panel of judges in September and representing the State of

Wisconsin on stage at the National FFA Convention on November 3.
