Facilities Committee

The Facilities Committee met on November 27. The topics are noted below with summary notes after the items.

Continued discussion on enhancements to athletic facilities

Mr. Yerkey and Mr. Sloma provided an update on the list compiled by Mr. Sloma over the summer. There were many topics that were discussed at the meeting but the research on potentially getting water to the stadium is what we will continue to evaluate options for.

The list covered did not introduce any new items; all were previously included in earlier capital projects plans but were not approved in a referendum brought to the community, able to be funded, or not recommended for consideration by the committee to the full Board.

Lastly, the committee wrapped up this agenda item with the knowledge that a focus of the Continuous Improvement Strategic plan addresses Sustainability Planning under the Financial and Operational Section.



The goal is to continue to target items from the referendum passed in 2018 but to continue to revise the 10 year capital projects plan used for the 2018 referendum.

B. Review of snow removal bids Board took official action on the bids at the November 27 meeting. C. Review of high school roof bids Committee reviewed options and bids and tonight's agenda includes a recommendation.

D. Review of 2024 school bus purchase bus bids



Bids were received for six buses for the 2024-25 budget. The committee will continue to review options to make a formal recommendation at a future meeting.

E. Review of Sugar Bush heat pumps options
The committee supported updating the pumps if the
need arises.

Property Tax Bills

Property tax bills are likely in the hands of many property owners. A few notes are summarized below to help answer any questions:

- The levy approved by the Board was 21% higher than 2022.
- The mill rate (5.95) approved by the Board was 7% higher than 2022.
- Property valuation increased by 13.2%.
- Depending on the municipality the property tax owner lives in, the net school property tax impact could vary significantly.
- Overall, taxpayers will see an increase to the school portion of property taxes.

A key factor to share when discussing the tax bills this year was the District's ability to secure more funding as a low revenue limit district. New London still is at the floor (\$11,000) for the revenue limit per student and also is below the state average (7.18) for mill rate.

Academic Career Planning for 2024

All future freshmen and their parents will be receiving information about the Academic and Career Planning process soon. This will occur on Monday, January 8, 2024, at the High School. New London strives to engage our students in a variety of opportunities during their high school career. Our goal for the Academic and Career Planning Process is to make sure all students and families are informed consumers of the educational options New London High School has to offer. An overview of the scheduling process, graduation requirements and career and college readiness advice will be available in the Academic and Career Planning materials.

The first focus will be on 9th arade scheduling and ACP planning. The high school counselors will be creating a presentation to share with parents with all the resources included. The high school counselors will share the slide show with



everyone. They will also create a scheduling video with step-by-step directions on how to schedule classes. The presentation will cover scheduling, pathways, academic planning, and a variety of other information. The counselors will also be presenting something similar on a smaller scale to all 8th grade students the week before Monday, January 8, 2024. The counselors will inform all parents/students about the scheduling process; they will also visit the middle school in mid January and meet with each student individually to discuss and check their schedule selections.
