

Total Compensation Committee Meeting

The Total Compensation Committee met on January 25 to review the following agenda items:

A. Review of 403(b) matching program options



The committee reviewed and is very close to finalizing a recommendation to bring to the full Board for review and approval to implement this year.

B. Review of bus driver recruitment options

The committee discussed several options to strategically address the district's bus driver shortage. Surrounding district data and private contractor data was reviewed to bring a formal recommendation to the Board for consideration on February 8, 2021.

C. Review of 2021-22 CPI for base wage increases

The CPI for base wage increase is 1.23% for wages July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022. The committee suggested moving forward with the past process to provide wage increases to staff and will bring a formal recommendation to the Board in March.

D. Review of employee incentives

The committee evaluated options to provide staff with a 1x incentive for the 2020-21 year for the extraordinary efforts many have taken to provide education to students during the COVID-19 challenges. The district will receive additional CARES Act Funding that could pay for this incentive.

The committee will continue to discuss options and funding methods to potentially make a recommendation to the Board for consideration.

E. Review of current certified staff equity benchmarks

The committee revisited the discussion about equity benchmarks for certified staff that was discussed at prior meetings.
