Total Compensation Committee Update

The Total Compensation Committee met on February 6 and the agenda topics are noted below.



A. Public Input

- The school counseling team shared feedback on wages for school counselors
- The high school shared the importance of super subs
- B. Review and discussion of staff survey
 - The committee discussed feedback and themes from the School Perceptions survey
- C. Review and discussion of 2023-24 CPI for base wages
 - The CPI for 23-24 is 8.01%. The committee is hoping to recommend as close to 8.01% as possible depending on the district budget
- D. Review and discussion of addition of substitute pay rates
 - o Recommended an increase to the Board
- E. Review and discussion of years of service program stipends
 - 5 years of payments have benefited all staff; the committee will recommend continuing the program
- F. Update on health/dental insurance renewals that started January 1
 - o Positive transition so far

Facilities Committee Update

The Facilities Committee met on February 6 and the topics are noted with updates.

- A. Review and Discussion of Sugar Bush Project Bids
 - Reviewed bids and alternates to formulated recommendations

- Asked for a walkthrough of Sugar Bush at next meeting
- B. Discussion of School Bus Purchasing Budget
 - No bus purchase recommended for 2023-24 budget
- C. Discussion on Automotive Curriculum Facility Needs
 - Lift will be donated by Plach Automotive and electrical by Northland
 - Potential for more costs once curriculum is built
- D. Review and Discussion of Tennis Court Project
 Bids
 - Bids for courts was about \$700,000
 - Lights would cost between \$110,000 -\$185,000
 - No formal recommendations at this point because budget uncertainty
- E. Update on Capital Projects Budget
 - Discussed another interaction of a Facilities
 Plan to develop next scope of project work

Summer School Save the Date

The purpose of the School District of New London Summer School Program is to provide opportunities



for learning beyond the traditional school year. With a commitment to **Success for ALL Students**, we offer something of interest for all ability levels. Courses are designed to offer enrichment and intervention of skills as well as expose students to new applications of knowledge and talents.

Session 1: June 5 - 22 (Grades 6-12)
Recovery/Remediation/Intervention
Session 2: July 10 - July 27 (4K-grade 8)
3 week programs and mini week sessions
*With few exceptions, there will be NO courses
on Fridays

In addition to these dates, some special activities like readiness skills, activities, and strength and conditioning may cross over sessions.

<u>Virtual Learning Options and Open Enrollment</u> Window

The School District of New London continues to offer virtual options for students with **Rural Virtual**



Academy. Request for enrollment in this virtual option is the same as the state open enrollment window. New London is proud to have this option available for families. Families who have any interest, even if they are unsure of commitment

level, should apply to hold the spot. Final rosters will be determined in August next year, but enrollment is processed in the following priority order:

- 1) Current students and their families
- 2) New applications in order they were received

*Class sizes and special education needs will be considered to determine acceptance.

Families who do not live in our resident area, but are interested in attending New London, should also fill out the application for open enrollment. **Open**

Enrollment Period for the 2023-24 school year is February 6 - April 28, 2023.
