Virtual Learning Options and Open Enrollment Window is OPEN

The open enrollment application period for the 2024-25 school year is February 5 - April 30, 2024 at 4:00 p.m.

The School District of New London continues to offer virtual options for students with **Rural Virtual**



Academy. Request for enrollment in this virtual option is the same as the state open enrollment window. New London is proud to have this option available for families. Families who have any interest, even if they are unsure of commitment level, should apply to hold the spot. Final rosters will be determined in August next year, but enrollment is processed in the following priority order:

- 1) Current students and their families
- 2) New applications in order they were received

*Class sizes and special education needs will be considered to determine acceptance.
