School Bus Drivers Needed

The transportation department has done a fantastic job of ensuring that routes have been running smoothly so far this year. A huge credit goes to the transportation office and all of our bus drivers in making that happen.



That said, we are in dire need of more bus drivers. We have three PM routes and two AM routes that are vacant. Thankfully we have a few sub drivers that understand the challenges we are facing and continue to drive.

Frankly put, if we do not get more drivers, we may be challenged to run routes differently. This will put families and students in challenging situations in order to be transported to school.

The district will continue to seek every possible option to secure more drivers. If you know of anyone that would be interested, please contact the transportation department at 920-982-8543. We provide paid training and some could be licensed in a few weeks time frame if they make the commitment. Pay is noted in the next section:

- Hourly Route Pay = \$19.79
- After One Year, Route Pay = \$22.79
- Training time is reimbursed after 20 trips/routes

- Hourly Sub Pay for Driver = \$21.90 after 50 trips/routes
- Field Trip Pay = \$12.17 paid for drive time and wait time

Mrs. Meina was able to meet with several of those students this week and distributed their glasses to them and watched their reaction as they were able to use their glasses for the first time. The remainder of the donation has been distributed throughout the district to students who have been identified as having a color blind impairment.

Child Development Days

Our final child development day screening is scheduled for Tuesday, January 26, 2021, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., at Lincoln Elementary School. This developmental screening is designed for children 2½ to 4 years old.

The screening process allows children to separate from their parents to participate in a play-based screening to observe speech/language, cognition, gross and fine motor, and self-help skills. During the screening, parents are able to chat with our elementary principals and then will be directed to our community area to speak with our school nurse, 4K staff, and gather other informational resources. A

great deal of additional PPE equipment and procedures will be put in place to allow for this event to take place safely.

Instructional Committee



Our last instructional committee met on December 15, 2020. The agenda included discussion on New Class Adoption Request for History of Rock and Roll 1 and 2 which was approved as long as no increased staffing was required and that

core academic courses be filled first. We also discussed the changes in processing Youth Options and part-time open enrollment requests to confirm the Board of Education would be kept informed, but was not required to approve. The committee also discussed middle school scheduling and courses to encourage additional electives. Our next meeting will be focused on the need for ongoing online learning opportunities for our students and those from other districts as a method to maintain or increase

enrollment in the future. Our next meeting is scheduled January 28, 2021, at 4:15 pm. at the District Office. At this meeting we will focus on digital learning options and the need to sustain options in the future.

End of the Semester

January 21, 2021 marks the end of the semester for all students. There is professional development (no school for students) the following day, January 22, 2021, to allow for records and grading updates. The first day of second semester is January 25, 2021.

Students in grades K-4 will have report cards sent home via Thursday folders the following week. Secondary level grades can be monitored and viewed on Skyward. The deadline for changing programming from traditional instruction to New London Connect was December 18, 2020. Update Your Chromebook

- Turn on your Chromebook.
- Connect your Chromebook to Wi-Fi.
- At the bottom right, select the time.
- Select Settings .
- Select Menu

 About Chrome OS.
- Under "Google Chrome OS," you'll see which version of the Chrome operating system your Chromebook is using.
- Select Check for Updates.
- If your Chromebook finds a software update, it will start to download automatically.
