#### **STEP Program**

The Senior Tax Exempt Program was created to support individuals who are 62 years of age and older who primarily live within the School District of New London and have property, and pay property



taxes within the District. STEP individuals work within our schools and support District operations with services earning a stipend to offset their local property taxes expenditures.

Integrating our STEP workers into our school community has historically offered our students and District staff various support services that bridge the generational gap. Additionally, giving STEP workers a chance to work directly in our local school gives first-hand knowledge of how learning environments of today operate and gives them a better knowledge base from which to make informed decisions.


#### **Property Tax Bills**

Many people pay property tax bills in late December and January.

A few notes to help answer any questions property owners may have:

 The levy approved by the Board was 10% lower than 2021

- The mill rate approved by the Board was 15% lower than 2021
- Property valuation increased by 7.6%.
- Depending on the municipality the property tax owner lives in, the net school property tax impact could vary. Generally speaking, taxpayers should see a decrease in their school portion of property taxes.

#### **Child Development Days**



Our final child development day screening is scheduled for Thursday, January 26, 2023, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at Lincoln Elementary School. This

developmental screening is designed for children 2½ to 4 years old.

The screening process allows children to separate from their parents to participate in a play-based screening to observe speech/language, cognition, gross and fine motor, and self-help skills. During the screening, parents are able to chat with our elementary principals and then will be directed to our community area to speak with our school nurse, 4K staff, and gather other informational resources.

### **ACCESS Testing Has Concluded**



Federal and state laws require that students identified as English Learners (ELs) be assessed annually to determine their

level of English language proficiency (ELP) and ensure that they are progressing in achieving full English proficiency. This includes students who receive special education services.

The ACCESS assessment window this year was from December 1, 2022, thru January 27, 2023. The School District of New London has over 100 students taking the ACCESS assessment. At this time, our district is 100% complete with testing. Our bilingual teachers and tutors complete this testing with our students and results will be shared with families when they arrive.

## **Dynamic Learning Maps Testing Window**

Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) assessments are for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities for whom general state assessments are not appropriate, even with accommodations. DLM assessments offer these students a way to show what they know and can do in English language arts, mathematics, and science. This year the test window will be March 20-April 28, 2023.

### 4K Enrollment/Registration
