## **Director of Business Services**

## **Town of Clayton**

The district has been working with the Town of Clayton (Winnebago County) for almost a decade to reconcile a property tax bill issue. The school district's property lines extend into a small portion of the Town of Clayton but those properties had other

school districts listed on the official tax records. This happens at times when properties are sold and it can be extremely challenging to get this changed. This is not an error by the district so there is little we can do besides keep asking to get it reconciled.

The outgoing treasurer called me to let me know we were finally able to get this sorted out and it will be corrected for 2019. It will have minimal impact for the district because the land is owned by the DNR and the other is a field/shed but the property will now show properly in the district's valuations and payment in lieu of taxes revenue.

Thank you to Tori Straw for working on this with us to get this correct.

# July 1 Equalization Aid Estimate

The July 1 equalization aid estimate was released by DPI (Department of Public Instruction).



The Department releases their best estimate on July 1 to inform school districts on the approximate equalization aid they will

receive on the October 15 official certification date.

This is a key number used by the Board of Education when setting the tax levy. This number is especially important to New London because state equalization aid is the primary source of revenue for our general operating budget (about 65% of revenue limit authority).

A key element to note is that **more** or **less** equalization aid, <u>does not</u> mean more or less money to spend in the district's budget. More equalization aid offsets the contribution by local taxpayers towards the general operating budget.

As I have noted before, I anticipated less aid for this year because the district's spending was less in 2018-19 because the high school referendum bonds were satisfied and the referendum passed in November 2019 was less than that annual amount.

DPI's estimate for New London is \$15,445,187, which is .002% <u>less</u> (\$36,694) than 2018-19.

Please note, spending authority is determined by the state imposed revenue limits which are projected to increase for New London because the district is a low revenue limit district.

The estimate is higher than I shared with the Board on June 10 but there is still a lot to happen over the next couple months. I will keep the Board posted as we get closer to the budget hearing in September when more definitive data will be available.
