#### **Facilities Committee**

The Facilities Committee met on May 24 and the agenda items are noted below with a short summary:

• Contract with Kobussen expires Julv 31. 2021

The committee discussed renewing the Kobussen Agreement, posting for a district management team and contracting all



transportation services. The committee will continue to review options but recommended posting the management position to see what candidates emerge for consideration.

• Discussion on scope of work and opinion of probable costs for ISMS project work

The committee will continue to evaluate options as the project scope of work and more definitive pricing comes forward. The market is extremely volatile and will impact the project approved by the Board.

• Update on HS Tech space enhancements and equipment purchases

The committee plans a walkthrough in June to review options for enhancements. Several new equipment items have already been ordered for the department.

• Update on tennis court discussions

The committee reviewed costs for onsite courts and costs to partner with the City. City Administrator, Chad Hoerth was present to answer questions. The consensus from all parties is that the current courts are in very poor condition and something needs to be done.

The committee gave a recommendation to continue planning for updates to items such

as windows, HVAC, flooring, electrical and plumbing. The preliminary timeline would be Summer 2022 for any work.

#### State Budget Information

There is a lot of information out there about the 2021-23 state biennium budget. This is normal and there will be negotiations between sides before an official budget is approved.



At the June 28 meeting, we will provide the most up-to-date information that we have and how proposals impact the District. Strong support

by the State for public education is critical to the fiscal sustainability of the District and our hope is that this translates to the biennium budget for a positive outlook.

#### St. Vincent de Paul Donation

#### Additional NVCI trainer

Brenda Fischer (educational assistant at New London Intermediate/Middle School) has added her certification as a Non-Violent Crisis Trainer. She will join Megan Diley (who is currently certified) as a team. Both of these instructors will be able to certify the remainder of our staff in the use of Non-Violent Crisis Intervention. This additional training will allow us to manage our compliance and train our safety/crisis teams on a more regular basis. Mrs. Diley and Ms. Fischer will hold trainings over the summer. We are happy to have this flexibility available with their added capacity in our buildings. Sincere thanks to Brenda and Megan and those who participated in these training sessions.

#### Heartsaver Training Updated HeartSaver School

The Pupil Services Department and the nursing program will be maintaining the training that establishes the School District of New London as a Heartsaver School. This will entail updated training for the staff annually on the use of defibrillator equipment that is placed throughout our district and in all of our school buildings. We will practice use of this equipment during our safety drills.
