Health Insurance Update

On June 1, WEA Trust announced that they will discontinue health insurance coverage for all customers as of December 31, 2022.

School District of New London receives 3 RtI (Response to Intervention) Awards

Recently, the Wisconsin RtI Center recognized our school at the Bronze level for our work toward fully implementing a school-wide system that, according to national research, leads to improved student outcomes. The schools in New London that received this recognition were: Lincoln Elementary, Parkview Elementary and New London Intermediate/Middle School.



By establishing our equitable, multi-level system of supports, we increase consistency of effective instruction, build staff knowledge and skills to equitably support all learners, use data to proactively identify and provide support for students, and create a positive culture that nurtures relationships with students and their families, and communities. This strong foundation helps learners gain the skills needed to graduate ready for college or a career!

CPR Training Refreshers In Progress

The School District of New London is in the process of updating 30+ staff members with their CPR (CardioPulmonary Resuscitation) training. We currently have about 50% of the staff up to date with their training. These staff are teachers, office staff, administration, coaches and educational assistants. These staff are represented across all buildings, so that there is a large quantity of trained staff available in each building. These staff are also part of the

crisis response teams in each building. Members of the staff are certified in either the Red Cross CPR training or the American Heart Association CPR training. An additional trainer joined the training team this year, Jennifer Doran (HS Science Teacher) is now part of the training team in the district. Thanks to Jennifer for her commitment to offer this service to our staff members.

Non-Violent Crisis Intervention Refreshers Underway

Last year Brenda Fischer (educational assistant at New London Intermediate/Middle School) added her certification as a Non-Violent Crisis Trainer. She joined Megan Diley (who is currently certified) as a team. Both of these instructors will work together this summer and into next school year to be able to certify the remainder of our staff in the use of Non-Violent Crisis Intervention. This ongoing training will allow us to manage our compliance and train our safety/crisis teams on a regular basis. Mrs. Diley and Ms. Fischer will hold trainings over the summer. We are happy to have this flexibility available with their added capacity in our buildings. Sincere thanks to Brenda and Megan for offering these training sessions.

Heartsaver Training Updated HeartSaver School

The Pupil Services Department and the nursing program will be maintaining the training that establishes the School District of New London as a Heartsaver School. This will entail updated training for the staff annually on the use of defibrillator equipment that is placed throughout our district and in all of our school buildings. We will practice use of this equipment during our safety drills.
