Biennium Budget Update

The Joint Finance Committee continues to meet to work towards the 2023-25 biennium budget. As I write this section on June 6, the process appears to be moving towards an approval after July 1.

Please continue to advocate for significant investments in revenue limit increases, special education aid and spending that keeps pace with inflation.

Lastly, DPI has confirmed that the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 (debt ceiling) did not impact the ESSER Funds. We should plan on continuing to spend as approved by the Board.

The second phase of the ISMS project with Milbach Construction has begun. The significant portion of this phase includes the main hallway bathrooms, principal's office and electrical work.

The Sugar Bush Elementary project began as well. We will continue to update the Board as necessary and keep you posted on any issues.

CPR Training Refreshers In Progress

The School District of New London is in the process of updating 30+ staff members with their CPR (CardioPulmonary Resuscitation) training. We currently have about 50% of the staff up to date with their



training. These staff are teachers, office staff, administration, coaches and educational assistants. These staff are represented across all buildings, so that there is a large quantity of trained staff available in each building. These staff are also part of the crisis response teams in each building. Members of the staff are certified in either the Red Cross CPR training or the American Heart Association CPR training. An additional trainer joined the training team this year, Annie Schmidt (District Physical Therapist) is now part of the training team in the district. Thanks to Annie for her commitment to offer this service to our staff members.

Non-Violent Crisis Intervention Refreshers Underway

Last year Brenda Fischer (educational assistant at New London Intermediate/Middle School) added her certification as a Non-Violent Crisis Trainer. She joined Megan Diley (who is currently certified) as a team. Both of these instructors will work together this summer and into next school year to be able to certify the remainder of our staff in the use of Non-Violent Crisis Intervention. This ongoing training will allow us to manage our compliance and train our safety/crisis teams on a regular basis. We are happy to have this flexibility available with their added capacity in our buildings. Sincere thanks to Brenda and Megan for offering these training sessions.
