- \*January 11 (Tuesday) Verification of Declarations of Candidacy; drawing of lots for ballot order
- \*April 4 (Monday) Publish notice of election (*Press Star* publication on March 31)
- \*April 5 (Tuesday) Election
- \*April 25 (Monday) School Board members take office

#### **Construction Class Projects**

The concrete work noted above for the discus and shot put area is in a difficult location to haul in concrete. Trucks are large and space is limited to drive without creating damage to the grounds or potentially to a contractor's equipment who would transport the concrete to be poured.

Boldt donated a concrete buggy to haul the concrete. This is a generous donation because we rented one, and the donation eliminated renting a second one to complete the project. We thank The Boldt Company for the donation and appreciate their partnership.

#### **Child Development Days**

On Tuesday, October 12, 2021, the special education team conducted one of their child find activities. The early childhood staff organized this activity, and they were supported by our school psychologists, speech and language pathologists as well as our occupational and physical therapy department. Congratulations to the early childhood department for the excellent turn out at this event. The next Child Development Days will be held on Tuesday, January 25, 2022.

# **ACCESS for ELLs Testing**



ACCESS for ELLs is an English language proficiency assessment administered to Kindergarten

through 12th-grade students who have been identified as English language learners (ELLs). It is given annually in Wisconsin to monitor students' progress in acquiring academic English. ACCESS for ELLs testing window is about to open. Students will be testing this year from December 1, 2021, through January 28, 2022.

# School Report Cards: Parent's Right to Know



The public portal for school achievement results has been opened. When looking at these results, please note the following information:

- The tests were modified for COVID 19
- Students who did not take the test are counted in our results as not proficient
- We were advised not to compare results from year to year

I will be reviewing those results later this evening.

School report cards have not yet been released at this time. Each year, the state releases a school report card for every public school and district. At this time, the draft report cards were released to assure data quality and final report cards are expected to be released to the public later in November. Once released, we will update the link on our website regarding the reports as well as other information we feel is important to share.

A few cautions on the school report cards for this year:

- The rubrics were changed
- The data includes gap years
- The formulas changed
- They added category weights and a target group

With these changes, I caution you to compare our overall score to years past and to really wait until we can look at the results together (again, has to be after the public release).

When asked about our school and our report card, remember, we do not set this criteria. It is best to celebrate our success and know what we have achieved.

I look forward to presenting on this topic once the embargo on data is lifted.
