Hispanic Heritage Month

Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15 to October 15, by

celebrating the histories, cultures and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America. The observation started in 1968 as Hispanic Heritage Week under President Lyndon Johnson and was expanded by President Ronald Reagan in 1988 to cover a 30-day period starting on September 15 and ending on October 15. It was enacted into law on August 17, 1988, on the approval of Public Law 100-402.

The School District of New London has temporarily suspended the bilingual families celebration event previously scheduled on October 5, 2020 and it will be rescheduled at a later date.

Child Development Days Moved to January



Child Development Days (the School District of New

London's annual child-find process) was scheduled to take place on Tuesday, October 13 at Lincoln Elementary School. At this time, that activity will now take place on Tuesday, January 26. The district will continue to process through special education referrals

received from outside agencies and sources. We still plan to conduct hearing, vision, speech and cognitive assessments during our Child Development Days event in January.



SHAPES Survey

Two weeks ago our high school Allies in Mental Health team conducted the SHAPES survey for the high school. The SHAPES is the School Health Assessment and Performance Evaluation System. This tool helps schools determine if they need to make any improvements in their mental health support systems. Members of this team included the high school administration team, school psychologist, school counselors, pupil services staff members and also school board member, Tina Ruckdashel. The team worked as a group to ask critical questions and examine any lagging areas that needed to be addressed to meet the students' mental health needs. This group will continue to work as a team throughout the year and will continue to provide updates to the School Board.

Bulldogs of Character/Pumpkin Donation



Festival Foods and Cuff's Berry Farm generously donated pumpkins to our Bulldogs of Character program in the district. The Bulldogs of Character program will be distributing pumpkins to students via the food pick-up sites at town.
