Allies in Mental Health Training

On Tuesday, August 18, and Wednesday, August 19, members of our high school staff and pupil services team, as well as school board member, Tina Ruckdashel participated in the Allies in



Mental Health training. This is a comprehensive mental health system model which is being led by CESA 6. Our team will meet periodically this year to continue our work to increase support and services for mental health in our district. This will be a two-year process. We are in Cohort group 3 with CESA 6 and other districts are joining us in this training.

Outside Counseling Providers

Rawhide Counseling Services provided a mental health training on August 24 to our entire district staff. The topic they addressed was "Dealing with Stress and Anxiety during the Pandemic."



Rawhide is one of the district's outside counseling providers in the School District of New London. The district also has Memorandums of Understanding with: Sherman, Integrity, Open Trails, Full Circle, Rawhide, Samaritan, and Rapha Counseling Services.

The School District of New London will continue their collaboration with these agencies this year to provide easy access to mental health support for our students and families.

Crisis Plan Updates

All of the building level crisis plans have been



updated. Each building level principal conducted training on the building specific crisis plans during August inservice week. The crisis teams will also continue to update their Heartsaver training each year.

PPE Update

All buildings throughout the district have been supplied with their necessary PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) materials. These materials include: mask, face shields, protective goggles, distancing stickers. Many buildings are also using movement arrows. Hand sanitizing stations are present outside each classroom and in common areas throughout the buildings. The thermometer stations are at all the main entrances and offices have additional hand-held thermometers available.

Eyeglasses Donation for Color Blind Students

The School District of New London received an anonymous donation of 80 pairs of eyeglasses that assist students who have been identified as struggling with colorblindness.

These glasses assist students with detecting differences between colors. They also add additional vibrancy to the colors that people with color blindness may not fully experience.



The eyeglasses will be distributed to students who are identified as color blind, throughout the School District of New London.
