- SPED = 2 routes

Mental Health Grant Received

The School District of New London was awarded \$56,000 for our Mental Health Grant application. This will allow the Pupil Services Department to continue to build on areas within our programming, including Social Emotional Learning programming and support of our mental health initiatives.

Allies in Mental Health Training-Year 2

Once again, members of our high school staff and pupil services team, as well as school board member Tina Ruckdashel, will participate in the Allies in Mental Health training. This is a comprehensive



mental health system model which is being led by CESA 6. Our team will meet periodically this year to continue our work to increase support and services for mental health in our district. This will be a two-year process. We are in Cohort group 3 with

CESA 6 and other districts are also participating in this training.

Outside Counseling Providers

The district continues to have Memorandums of Understanding with: Sherman, Integrity, Open Trails, Full Circle, Rawhide, Samaritan, and Rapha Counseling Services.



The School District of New London will continue their collaboration with these agencies this year to provide easy access to mental health support for our students and families.

These agencies have the opportunity to be physically present to offer their therapy services during the school day on our campus to allow for easy access to mental health care. Students are able to attend appointments during the school day, without their parents needing to take off of work to transport them. This helps eliminate the barrier to accessing mental health care services for our families and provides convenience for access.

Resiliency Training

During our August inservice training, Rogers Behavioral Health Services presented a large-group resiliency training to our entire support staff and professional staff. This was an opportunity for staff to reflect on last year and gear up for working with students this school year. This session received a great deal of positive feedback from the staff and interest in continued discussion on this topic.
